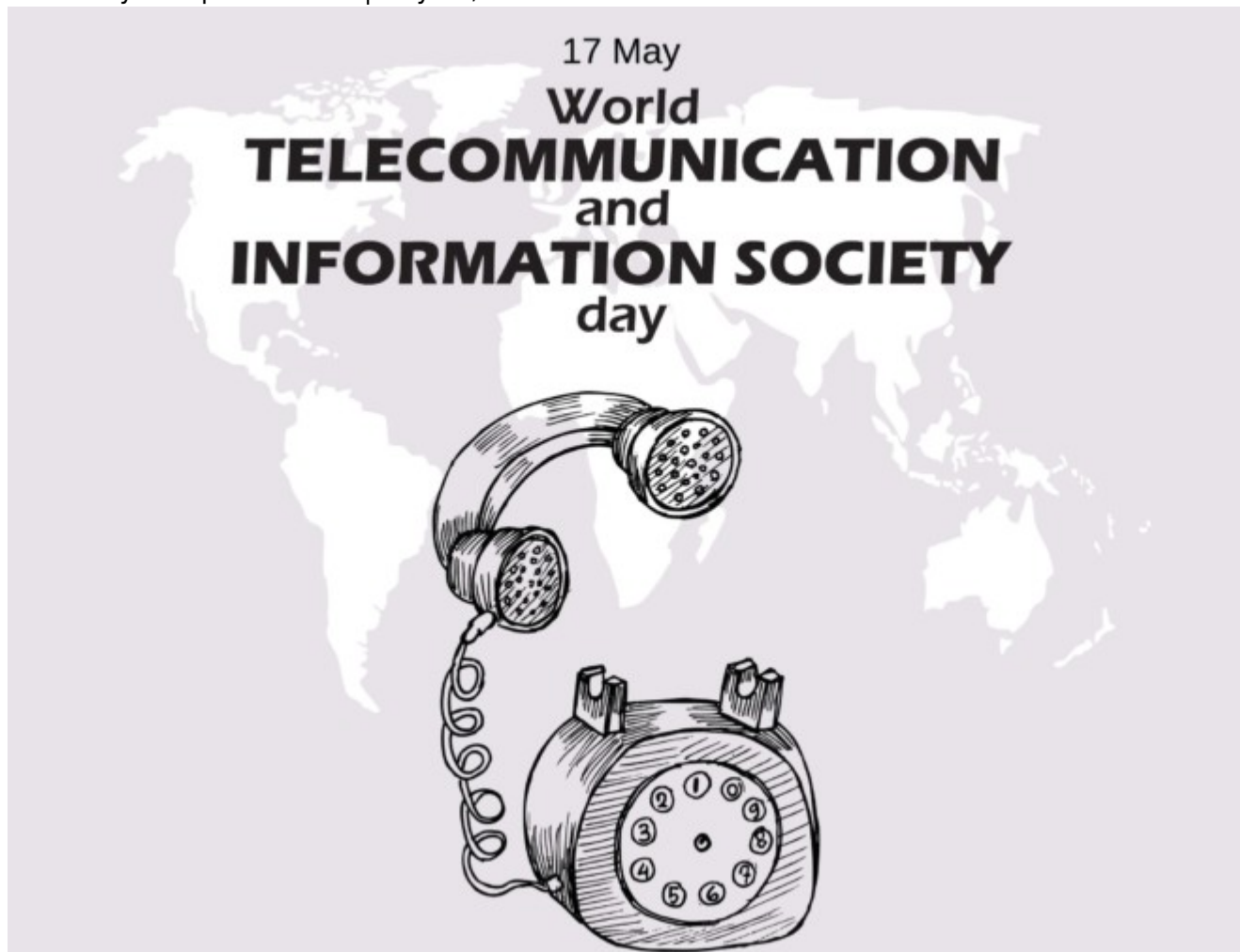


WORLD TELECOMMUNICATIONS & INFORMATION SOCIETY DAY, 17 MAY 2021

Today is World Telecommunications & Information Society Day. This day is celebrated annually on the 17th of May to mark the founding of the [International Telecommunications Union](#) (ITU) and to commemorate the signing of the first International Telegraph Convention which took place on the 17th of May 1865. The aim of celebrating this day is to raise awareness of the role of communication technology and the potential it has to bridge the digital and economic divide that is prevalent in most societies.

The theme for 2021 is “Accelerating Digital Transformation in challenging times”.
